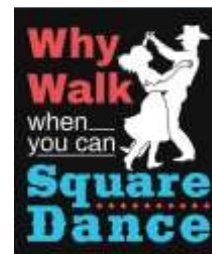
Square Dancing is Fun

The COE does not accept reservations more than 6 months in advance. There is a security gate that locks at 10 p.m. and there is no code. However, you can leave a buddy's car just inside the gate and upon return from After Parties can use the emergency exit to re-enter and then drive buddy's car to campsite. There are a limited number of 50-amp spaces. Not all sites have sewer hookups but there is a sewer dump station. Closest COE parks are Midway Park (2332 W. 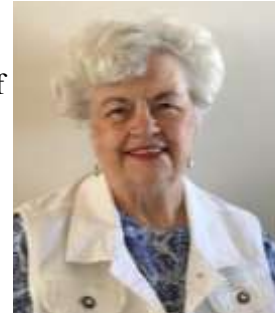
Eilene Rae Downie

What's Cooking

SAUSAGE EGG & CREAM CHEESE BREAKFAST

Ingredients

- 2 pkg crescent rolls
- 2 lbs cooked sausage
- 8 eggs
- 8 oz cream cheese (room temp)
- Salt & pepper to taste
- 2 c shredded cheese



Press 1 pkg crescent rolls into 9x13 pan (make sure to press the seams together). Spread the sausage evenly over the crescent rolls. Crack eggs into bowl and beat, add cream cheese and salt & pepper and mix until thoroughly blended, pour over sausage. Sprinkle 1 1/2 c cheese over the egg mixture. Spread the second package of crescent rolls out on wax or parchment paper to cover the ingredients in pan (make sure to press the seams together). Place on top of ingredients and sprinkle the rest of cheese over the crust.

Bake in a preheated 350 degrees oven for 20-25 minutes or until golden brown.



DUTCH OVEN DUMP CAKE

Ingredients

- 2 cans pie filling (your favorite pie filling)
- 1 can sweetened condensed milk
- 1 yellow cake mix
- 1/2 c melted butter



Directions:

Dump the pie filling and sweetened condensed milk into the dutch oven skillet and mix. Sprinkle yellow cake mix evenly over the top and drizzle 1/2 c melted butter over the cake mix (covering as much of the mix as possible).

Bake at 350 degrees for 45 minutes or until golden brown.

Serve with ice cream, cool whip or without, ENJOY!
